The Friends 39th Annual Fall Book Sale is almost here!

September 11th through September 14th we will have one of the largest displays of pre-owned books in the country for sale at the Lake Forest Rec Center gym. Over 100,000 gently used books are sorted into over 115 categories. Several sections are alphabetized. COME HAVE A LOOK! You'll be amazed! There is no charge Friday through Sunday. Many people stock up for the winter's reading or buy like new books for presents. Also, thousands of DVDs, music CDs (a larger collection of classical than ever before), and books on CDs will be available.

The money raised supports the library's outstanding free programming for children, teens, adults and families throughout the year. This summer over 100 children learned about turtles and enjoyed a timed turtle race; over 250 people learned about caring for dogs and watched dogs interact with Frisbees on the front lawn. In all sixteen programs were provided for children with Book Sale funds this summer including: balloons, bubbles, circus acts, comedy, illusion, juggling, magic, marionettes, music, puppets, theater and wildlife. Each program enlightened and entertained up to 130 children.

Did you join the Pause to Read Adult Summer Reading program and win a prize or two? Or were you the Grand Prize drawing winner? This fun program for adults was provided by the library and funded by the Friends.

Book Sale money also paid for three \$2,000 scholarships, art awards at the schools, two Barbara Rinella performances, an art lecture by Jeff Nigro and helped fund the Lake Forest Reads Ragdale program and the new Media Lab. These "Extras" come from your volunteering and your donations to this huge community event – The Friends Fall Book Sale.

Donations can be made through August 31st. It takes time to sort, price and box the materials we receive.

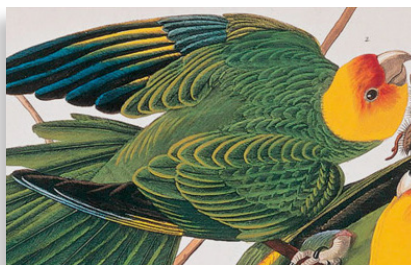

Lake Forest Reads: Ragdale 2014



Join your neighbors in reading *Into the Beautiful North* by Luis Alberto Urrea – the story of nineteen-year-old Nayeli who works at a taco shop in her Mexican village and dreams about her father, who journeyed to the U.S. when she was young. While watching the film, *The Magnificent Seven*, she decides to go north herself and recruit seven men – her own “Siete Magníficos” – to repopulate her hometown and protect

it from the bandidos who plan on taking it over. Copies of the book are available at Lake Forest Library.

Lake Forest Reads: Ragdale is a one book/one community program sponsored by Lake Forest Library and The Radgale Foundation. Community Partners include Dickinson Hall, Friends of Lake Forest Library and Lake Forest College. All programs are open to the public. Most are free unless otherwise noted.

Luis Alberto Urrea is a popular author and a 2005 Pulitzer Prize finalist for nonfiction. Lake Forest Library will host a presentation by the author on Tuesday 10/28/14 at 6 p.m. at the Lily Reid Holt Memorial Chapel, Lake Forest College. Seating is limited and free tickets are required.
