The Friends donated the major portion of the funds for this project. \$14,000 has been set aside to help the library with the cost of Summer Reading Programs for children and teens. \$7,000 has been allocated for teen, children and family reading groups and children's programming throughout the year. An additional \$9,000 will pay for adult book reviews, a writing group and a summer reading program. We will provide Barbara Rinella's portrayal of THE ART FORGER by B. A. Shapiro on Wednesday, April 17th, at Gorton Community Center at 3:30 p.m. Barbara will return Tuesday, October 22, with a program to be announced.

These are some of the expenditures being made this year.

All the money the Friends provide comes from Friends memberships, book sales and donations. No money is paid to officers or Friends board members.
