- 1. We welcomed

- 2. We celebrated 125 years of Lake Forest Library with a family fest complete with cookies, Kona shaved ice, The Left Bank hot dogs, face painting, a magic show, and the first-ever foam party!



- 3. The dome was restored! We celebrated with custom designed m&ms.
- 4. The dome restoration project received a 2024 Historic Preservation Award in the designation Rehabilitation from the Lake Forest Preservation Foundation.

Many of them had a great time attending Library events and widening their horizons through Summer Reading. Please remember that your Library is also a wonderful resource for research and information and our friendly Librarians are eager to assist students in all their class projects.

I am happy to report that libraries nationwide are emerging from the depths of the COVID-19 pandemic, and we are seeing an uptick in usage across the board. On pages 28–29, you likely noticed impressive increases in several key metrics. We are very encouraged by this trend, and I would like to highlight the hard work of your Library Staff who always go the extra mile to serve you.

As part of our continuing efforts to provide a wider range of library collections to our residents, we have just joined Find More Illinois which brings the collections of an additional 50+ libraries in the state to our existing consortium of 30+ libraries. We are also excited to announce that we will soon be adding a new vending machine at the West Train Station that will dispense the latest books and audiovisual materials. You will also be able to pick up your holds at the machine!

Facilities Staff and the Library Board Building Committee have been hard at work addressing several projects to enhance your beautiful Library building. We are having a new building automation system installed to provide uniform temperatures and comfort levels in all areas. We will be upgrading the existing elevator with more modern equipment and controls. Also underway is a study to restore and enhance the Library's front courtvards and the gates and benches near Deerpath that are showing signs of deterioration after decades of exposure to the elements. After the initial investigation is completed in the early fall, we plan to engage the community in discussions on next steps.

We are eager to welcome the many new residents of Lake Forest to our Library family. If you know of a new household that has moved recently to Lake Forest, please tell them about all the great things the Library provides for all ages.

When you next visit the Library, you may notice several new faces who have joined our team. This increased staffing enables us to support many of the initiatives that we will be rolling out as part of our 2024–27 Strategic Plan. We also welcome Emily Van Bel, Vince Sparrow, and Garth Pearson as the newest trustees on the Library's Board and thank them for their service.
